

MONOPOLY MILLIONAIRES' CLUB
NO VACANCY - RULES – v3 (as of 04-14-14)

GAME TITLE: No Vacancy

GAME SUMMARY: The Contestant must help book the Monopoly Hotel so there are no more vacancies. The “hotel” has three (3) floors with seven (7) rooms on each floor. “Guests” arrive in “limousines” and must be booked in rooms on the same floor. If the Contestant can successfully book all twenty-one (21) rooms, he or she wins the Game and \$100,000.

SCORING MECHANISM: A Contestant is shown a hotel with three (3) floors. Each floor has seven (7) rooms on it. Five (5) limousines drive up, each with a different number of guests from one to five. The Contestant chooses a limousine and the floor on which each of the guests will be booked. Each guest from a specific limousine must be booked on the same floor. If the Contestant can book all twenty-one (21) hotel rooms, he or she wins the Game, but if at any time, there are not enough rooms on a single floor to book all of the guests in the chosen limousine, the Contestant loses.

RULES:

- A. The Contestant is shown a hotel with three (3) floors. Each floor has seven (7) rooms. The hotel and rooms may be actual physical representations, graphic representations, “virtual” video items, models, or any other representation determined by Producer in its sole discretion.
- B. Each floor is worth a different dollar value. Rooms on the top floor are valued at \$3,000 each; rooms on the second floor are valued at \$2,000 each. Rooms on the bottom floor are valued at \$1,000 each.
- C. Five (5) limousines are displayed simultaneously. The limousines may be actual physical representations, graphic representations, “virtual” video items, models, or any other representation determined by Producer in its sole discretion.
- D. Each limousine contains a different, unknown number of guests from one to five. Limousines may be designated by color, number, letter, or some other identifying mark, but those will have no connection to the number of guests inside.
- E. The Contestant chooses a limousine and the number of guests inside is revealed. The other limousines drive off and are eliminated from play.
- F. The Contestant assigns the guests to a floor in the hotel. All guests must be booked in rooms on the same floor.
- G. The Contestant earns the amount of money for each room booked on that floor.
- H. Another five (5) limousines are displayed. Each limousine has a different, hidden number of guests from one to five. These may look like the same limousines from before, however, there is no connection between the number of guests in a specific limousine previously and the number now (e.g., the “red” limousine may have had 2 guests in it previously, but that has no relevance to the number of guests in it if it should appear again).
- I. The Contestant chooses a limousine from this group and the number of guests is revealed.

- J. The Contestant assigns these guests to a floor in the hotel. If a floor does not have enough available unoccupied rooms for all guests from a single limousine, the Contestant cannot assign the guests to that floor.
- K. Play continues with another five (5) limousines appearing each time. Each has a different, hidden number of guests, between one and five in each limousine.
- L. If and when a situation arises where the next limousine selected could have too many guests to be booked on a single floor (i.e., each floor has fewer than five available unoccupied rooms), the Host will offer the Contestant an opportunity to stop the Game and leave with whatever money they've earned to that point.
- M. If the Contestant takes the money, the Host may continue to play the Game to see what would have happened had the Contestant chosen to play, but once the Contestant chooses to stop the Game, any future Game play is for demonstration and does not impact the Contestant's winnings.
- N. If the Contestant chooses a limousine that has more guests than any single hotel floor can accommodate, the Game is over and the Contestant forfeits all of their winnings they have earned in the Game.
- O. If the Contestant can successfully book ALL hotel rooms on ALL floors, he or she wins the Game and \$100,000. This is the total amount the Contestant can win in the Game and NOT in addition to the amount earned until this point.

WINNER: If the Contestant can successfully assign ALL guests to ALL hotel rooms, he or she wins the Game and \$100,000.

In the event the Producer needs to stop the Game for any reason (including but not limited to human, mechanical, equipment failure, rule violation, or safety issues), the Contestants and/or the Game pieces (i.e., hotels, limousines) may be reset to a particular position, or the entire Game may be thrown out and restarted from the beginning, at Producer's sole and absolute discretion.

All decisions, including, without limitation, whether a Contestant has played the Game correctly and/or violated the rules in any other manner, will be made by the Producer in its sole discretion and are not subject to challenge or appeal.

The Producer reserves the right to modify these rules at any time, with or without notice, in its sole discretion.
